Today we begin a new Christian year with the start of Advent. We await Christ's coming in glory to be our judge, we recognise his coming to us now in the sacraments, we prepare to celebrate his birth at Bethlehem. Today we light the first of the four candles of the Advent wreath, each marking one of this seasons four Sundays.

Today's Bible Readings: This year, ('A' of the three year cycle of Sunday readings,) the Gospel will usually come from St Matthew. In today's extract we hear Christ urging his disciples to stay awake in readiness for the coming of the Son of Man, which will happen when we do not expect it – like a thief in the night, or like Noah's flood. This reflects the Advent theme of judgement, to the fore on this first Sunday. St Paul compares it to the night coming to an end, which means that with the dawning of Christ's day we must give up sinful deeds of darkness. But there is also the Advent hope of Messiah's coming, which will bring peace and unity to the nations, over whom he will rule dwelling on Mount Zion.

New Sunday Missals, dated for all the Sundays from Advent 2022 until the end of November 2023 are put into use in church, to assist you in following the Order of Mass, and the variable prayers and Bible readings of each. '**Walk with Me, A Journey of Prayer through Advent**' is a popular booklet helping us prepare for Christmas, giving us for each day a text a Bible reading, a reflection and a prayer. Now on sale at £1.
