Today we celebrate the Sunday of the Word of God. Instituted by Pope Francis as an annual celebration of the way God speaks to us through his Word in Scripture, it is a day when we bless our Parish Readers who proclaim the Word of God to us at Mass. Our Readers will receive the blessing at the Mass they normally attend. We are hoping to recruit some additional readers, and so we invite other parishioners who would like to be considered for this ministry to let us know.

Parish Readers and those interested in becoming Readers please take a free copy of the leaflet 'Being a Reader at Mass' from the back of the church.

Today's Bible Readings

Old Testament Reading: 'The return of the people of Israel to their homeland after the Babylonian exile was marked by the public reading of the book of the Law. In the book of Nehemiah, the Bible gives us a moving description of that moment. The people assembled in Jerusalem, in the square before the Water Gate, to listen to the Law. They had been scattered in exile, but now they found themselves gathered "as one" around the sacred Scripture (Neh 8:1). The people lent "attentive ears" (Neh 8:3) to the reading of the sacred book, realizing that in its words they would discover the meaning of their lived experience.' (From the Apostolic Letter of Pope Francis instituting this Sunday of the Word of God)

The Gospel: In the synagogue of Nazareth, his home town, very early in his ministry Jesus proclaims the Word of God from the prophet Isaiah. He unrolls the scroll and reads, 'The Spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for he has anointed me. He has sent me to bring the good news to the poor... ' On concluding the passage, he begins to preach by saying 'This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen.' Jesus was anointed as the Christ, the long awaited Messiah, by the Holy Spirit at his baptism in the River Jordan, and from now on will begin to carry out his messianic role, which continues in our own day through the Church proclaiming his Word.

Last Sunday was White Flower Sunday. The collection in support of the work of the Society for the Protection of Unborn Children raised £408. Thank you for your generosity.

Monday, the Feast of SS Timothy & Titus, the disciples of St Paul, is the anniversary of the episcopal ordination of Cardinal Vincent Nichols, (1992.) He was an Auxiliary Bishop of Westminster, before becoming Archbishop of Birmingham, and then Archbishop of Westminster.

Tuesday is the Feast of the Conversion of St Paul, and the last day of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. The chapel to the right of the front of the church is dedicated to St Joseph & St Paul. The reredos at the back of the chapel depicts St Paul's conversion. St Paul is also the subject of the stained glass window above it.

The Christmas Crib remains in the church until Candlemas, 2nd February, the time when the 40 day old infant Jesus was presented in the Temple and revealed as the light of the nations and the glory of Israel.

Crib Offerings go towards the work of the Catholic Children's Society with needy families in our Diocese of Westminster. The Crib Offerings are the main annual source of their income. Parents – do bring your children to visit the Infant Jesus in the Crib, light a candle and say a prayer for children in need, and make an offering to help them.
