Today's Bible Readings

In the First Reading the prophet Isaiah tells the people of Israel that if they share their bread with the hungry, house the homeless poor, and clothe the naked, their light will break forth like the dawn.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples, 'You are the light of the world...let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works, and give glory to your Father in heaven.' He also tells them they are the salt of the earth.

In the Second Reading we St Paul tells his converts that he did not come to preach to them with lofty speech or wisdom, and knew nothing among them except Jesus Christ crucified. His message was not couched in words of wisdom, but was a demonstration of the power of the Holy Spirit.

Installation of Archbishop Richard Moth

Please pray for our new Archbishop of Westminster to be installed in Westminster Cathedral next weekend, Archbishop Richard Moth, (previously Bishop of Arundel and Brighton.)

On Friday, the eve of Installation, there is Solemn Vespers at 5.30 pm, at which Archbishop Richard will give the homily. In addition to our parish representatives, there is now space for others to attend, without needing a ticket.
