Today's Bible Readings

The Prophet Ezekiel responds to those who say the Lord is not just, by announcing God's words that a righteous person who then descends into injustice, will die, but that the wicked person who changes to doing right, will save his life.

St Paul tells the Philippians that they ought to look to other people's interests rather than to their own, as did Christ Jesus. He then quotes what may have been an early Christian hymn: 'Though he was in the form of God, Jesus emptied himself by taking the form of a servant...and humbled himself to the point of death on a cross... Therefore God has highly exalted him.'

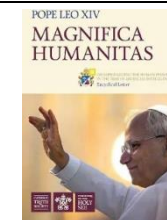
Jesus tells a parable about two sons, who are asked by their father to go and work in his vineyard. One says no, but later changes his mind and actually goes. The second agrees to go, but in the end does not. As Jesus' followers we are asked to labour in the vineyard of his church, to assist in bringing in the harvest of souls. Only if we actually do so will we be doing the will of our heavenly Father.

There are several special feast days this week: Tuesday is Michaelmas, the holy archangels Michael, Gabriel, Raphael; Wednesday St Jerome, the patron of those who study the Bible, Thursday St Therese of the Child Jesus, whose little way has made her the most popular saint of modern times; and Friday our Holy Guardian Angels.

Following the Talk by Fr Terry Tastard last week about his new book, 'Voices from the Fringe – Asking Who Jesus Might Be', it is possible to purchase a copy of the book at a reduced price. Adoremus: National Eucharistic Congress on Saturday 10th October

We have two parish delegates attending the Congress Mass in St George's Cathedral, Southwark. But all are invited to join the Procession of the Blessed Sacrament from St George's Cathedral, along the South Bank of the Thames, to Westminster Cathedral, beginning at 3.00 pm. It would be wonderful for as many as possible to join us for this public witness to our faith. It will finish at 5pm with Solemn Benediction at Westminster Cathedral presided over by Bishop Jim Curry. This will be followed by Mass at 6 pm. After another Mass at 8pm, the first of three Holy Hours will begin led by the youth ministry teams of Westminster, Southwark and CYMFed – the Catholic Youth Ministry Federation. The Holy Hours will include reflections on Eucharistic saints, prayer led by youth ministry teams and music from One Hope Project. From 11pm an all-night Vigil before the Blessed Sacrament begins, which will finish with Mass at 6am.
