**Our former parish priest Fr Terry Tastard has written a book** of 25 short stories asking how ordinary people interpreted Jesus. We hear a range of voices, such as a midwife, a physician, a religious expert, a spy, a bandit, an orphan and a waitress. They relate their encounter with Jesus as they piece together the clues and try to understand who he is. Each story is followed by related gospel passages, and an explanation of the cultural setting drawn from research of scholars into the historical Jesus. Each concludes with a spiritual reflection, about the message of Jesus for us. The book is called **Voices from the Fringe: Asking who Jesus might be** and is available from Amazon.

#### Today's Bible Readings

**In the Old Testament Reading** the prophet Jeremiah experiences hostility for proclaiming God's message, but he places his trust in the Lord who will act as a warrior to ensure his persecutors stumble. Jeremiah commits his cause to the Lord, and sings the praises of him who delivers the needy from the hand of evil doers.

**In the Second Reading** St Paul explains that death came into the world due to sinful Adam. Although many died due to one man's sin, the grace of God has now abounded for many, coming to us through the man, Jesus Christ, the new Adam.

**In the Gospel** Jesus tells his disciples not to fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Whoever acknowledges Jesus before men, he will acknowledge before his Father in heaven.

**Today the 11.30 am Solemn Mass will be a Thanksgiving Mass** for all our First Holy Communion children of the last few weeks and their families. The Mass will conclude with a brief period of Adoration and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Afterwards there will be a party in the Parish Centre for the First Communion children.

**A Warm Welcome to Father Vincent Nsumba**, our priest friend from Uganda, who will be staying with us in the parish until mid-August. Father Vincent teaches future priests in seminary in Northern Uganda.

**Monday is the Feast of SS John Fisher & Thomas More**, the greatest of the English martyrs of the Reformation era. They may be seen in the stained glass window over the over the choir gallery at the back of church.

**Wednesday is the Feast of the Nativity of St John the Baptist**, our Lord's forerunner.

**Saturday is the Feast of St John Southworth**, one of the English martyrs, a priest who ministered in the Westminster area, and whose body can be venerated in Westminster Cathedral.

**Sunday is the Solemnity of SS Peter & Paul, Apostles**, and a Day of Prayer for the Holy Father. The annual collection for Peter's Pence is taken after each Mass, which goes to support the Pope's charitable work throughout the world.
