Today's Bible Readings

The Prophet Amos denounces the rich people of Sion and Samaria who live a life of decadent luxury, but are culpably unaware of the imminent collapse of the kingdom.

St Paul exhorts his disciple Timothy, on whom he has laid hands in ordination, to pursue righteousness and godliness, and fight the good fight of the faith. He concludes with an ascription of praise to Christ, who will appear in due time as the King of Kings and Lord of lords.

In the Gospel Jesus tells the Pharisees the parable of the rich man who feasts every day and is clothed in fine linen, and is totally unaware of the abject suffering of the poor man Lazarus who lay outside his gate. In the next life, their fortunes are reversed: Lazarus is in the bosom of Abraham, and the rich man is tormented in Hades. He has not heeded the message of Moses and the prophets.

Today there is a Pastoral Letter from the Cardinal, celebrating the 175th Anniversary of the Diocese of Westminster. It is on the website and printed copies available at back of church. There is also a short, two-page history of our Diocese, written by the Diocesan Archivist.

There will be coffee served outside church after the 10.00 am Family Mass today, which gives us an extra opportunity to meet each other and to make new friends!

Almost every day this week has a beautiful feast day: Monday, the Holy Archangels; Tuesday, St Jerome, the first great Biblical scholar; Wednesday, St Therese of the Child Jesus, who proposed the Little Way; Thursday, our Guardian Angels; Saturday, St Francis of Assisi. Come to Mass as often as you can!

Friday is the CAFOD autumn Family Fast Day: we are invited to make an act of self-denial and give the money saved to CAFOD. The theme is 'Love your neighbour as yourself.' CAFOD says, 'Please help more of our neighbours get safe water for their families.' Collection after next Sunday's Masses. Envelopes available today, which make it possible to gift aid your donation.

There will be a collection of non-perishable foodstuffs for the Hammersmith & Fulham Foodbank on the weekend of 18th/19th October. They are also short of toiletries, shower gel, deodorant and toothpaste. Please bring your gifts with you to Mass that weekend only, and place in the special box in the porch.

The Stewards at Sunday 10.00 am Family Mass do a great job in welcoming parishioners as they arrive, providing them with the necessary books, helping them find a seat, and answering their questions.
