Today's Bible Readings

In the Old Testament Reading from the Wisdom Book of Sirach we are reminded that it is within our power to decide to keep the Commandments, and that God knows a person's every deed. The psalm which follows appropriately declares that those who walk in the law of the Lord are blessed

In the Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples that he has not come to abolish the Law and Prophets, but to fulfil them. He explains that observing merely the letter of the Law is not sufficient. E.g. Anger can ultimately lead to killing, lustful desires can lead to adultery.

In the Second Reading St Paul tells his converts that he does impart wisdom, but bot a wisdom of this age, rather the secret and hidden wisdom of God which he decreed before the ages for our glory. God has revealed to us through the Spirit the things he has prepared for those who love him.

Please pray for our new Archbishop of Westminster installed yesterday in Westminster Cathedral, Archbishop Richard Moth, (previously Bishop of Arundel and Brighton.) From now on, we pray for him by name in the Eucharistic Prayer of the Mass: 'Leo our Pope, and Richard our Bishop.'

This weekend there will be an Appeal on behalf of Mary's Meals, with a collection after Mass. This charity, based in Scotland, serves nutritious school meals to children living in some of the world's poorest countries. The promise of a good meal attracts these hungry children into the classroom, giving them the energy to learn and hope for a better future. Mary's Meals will also have a special announcement to make!

Tuesday is known in England as Shrove Tuesday, the day before Lent begins. 'Shrove' comes from being "shriven" which means going to Confession and being absolved. This will get our Lent off to a very good start. The 6.00 pm Mass will be for the Forgiveness and Sins, and Confessions will be available. At 6.30 pm.

The Rite of Election in the Cathedral next Saturday is the occasion when our four Parish Catechumens (adults preparing for baptism) and our candidate for reception into the Catholic Church, along with a few hundred others from all the parishes of the Diocese are chosen and blessed by the Archbishop to receive the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil this year. The Catechumens now become 'The Elect'. The season of Lent is their final period of intensive preparation, which we keep alongside them, as we prepare by prayer, self-denial and almsgiving to renew our own baptismal promises at Easter.
