Today's Bible Readings

In the First Reading from the Old Testament book of Sirach, the Divine Wisdom

speaks its praises: 'From eternity in the beginning he created me, and for eternity I shall not cease to exist...Then the Creator of all things commanded me, 'Make your dwelling in Jacob and in Israel receive your inheritance.'

In the Second Reading St Paul sings the praises of God who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, even as he chose us in him before the foundation of the world.

In the Gospel, the Prologue of St John's Gospel, the evangelist unfolds the mystery of the Incarnation of the Eternal Word of God. 'In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God,
