Today's Bible Readings

The First Reading The Acts of the Apostles describes how after the Ascension the apostles returned from Mount Olivet to Jerusalem and went to the upper room, where they joined in continuous prayer for nine days along with the women and Mary, the mother of Jesus.

In the Second Reading, St Peter reminds us that we must rejoice to share Christ's sufferings, that we may also rejoice when his glory is revealed. If we suffer because we are Christian we must not be ashamed, but glorify God in that name.

In the Gospel Jesus speaks his High Priestly Prayer at the Last Supper in the presence of the apostles, He says that he has finished the work on earth God gave him to do, and prays that God will now glorify him in his presence with the glory he had with him before the world existed. He has manifested the Father's name to those God gave him, and now he prays for them.

Preparation for the Sacrament of Baptism: If you have a child for **Baptism**, under 5 years old please email us for an application form. A copy of one of the Catholic parents' baptism certificate will be required. Baptisms can only take place on Saturdays at 11am.
