Dear brothers and sisters,

As many of you will have noticed, Hammersmith & Fulham Council has recently implemented new parking restrictions in the streets surrounding Holy Trinity Church. These include: Controlled parking hours extended until 11 pm and a maximum parking duration of 2 hours

Previously, parking was free in the evenings and all day Sunday.

These restrictions risk significantly reducing attendance at Sunday Mass and weekly community programs, especially for members who live outside the immediate area, have children, or are disabled. There is concern that some activities and services may need to be curtailed or closed if these changes remain in place.

We have sent a formal response to the council and we are inviting your support through a petition and community statement.

In the meantime, please allow a little extra time when travelling and check all parking signs carefully.

Thank you for your patience and for supporting our parish community as we work toward a fair and practical solution.

Today's Bible Readings

In the First Reading the prophet Isaiah tells King Ahaz the Lord gives him a sign: 'Behold the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Emmanuel.' The real fulfilment of this promise was not in the immediate political situation, but in the eventual birth of Christ, the long- awaited Messiah, from the Virgin Mary.

In the Second Reading St James urges us to be patient, as we await the Lord's coming, which is at hand, just as the farmer waits patiently for the harvest. We must be at peace with one another because the Judge is standing at the door. We must learn from the patient suffering of the prophets, who spoke in the name of the Lord.

In the Gospel John the Baptist, now in prison because he had denounced King Herod's immoral marriage, sends out a message to Jesus to ask if he is indeed the promised Christ, or whether they must wait for someone else. Jesus sends back news of the many miracles of healing he has wrought, and his proclamation of the good news to the poor, as evidence that he is indeed the Messiah. Jesus praises John the Baptist, saying that he is greater than a prophet, and indeed the greatest man yet to be born — because he is the messenger who has prepared the way for Christ.

Today is Gaudete Sunday, the mid-Advent Sunday of rejoicing because Christ's coming is now near. The third candle on the Advent wreath and the vestments of the priest are both rose-pink in colour as a sign of our joy and hope..



Christ is successively described as the Wisdom of God, Mighty Lord, Root of Jesse, Key of David, Day-Spring, King of the Nations, Emmanuel. These will be illustrated day by day on the porch noticeboard, to assist our personal prayers.
