Dear brothers and sisters,

As many of you will have noticed, Hammersmith & Fulham Council has recently implemented new parking restrictions in the streets surrounding Holy Trinity Church. These include: Controlled parking hours extended until 11 pm and a maximum parking duration of 2 hours

Previously, parking was free in the evenings and all day Sunday.

These restrictions risk significantly reducing attendance at Sunday Mass and weekly community programs, especially for members who live outside the immediate area, have children, or are disabled. There is concern that some activities and services may need to be curtailed or closed if these changes remain in place.

We have sent a formal response to the council and we are inviting your support through a petition and community statement.

In the meantime, please allow a little extra time when travelling and check all parking signs carefully.

Thank you for your patience and for supporting our parish community as we work toward a fair and practical solution.

Today's Bible Readings

In the First Reading Isaiah prophesies that the root of Jesse (King David's father) will put forth a branch which will bear fruit, in its ultimate descendant – the Messiah – on whom the Spirit of the Lord will rest. His reign will usher in the age of peace.

In the Second Reading St Paul reminds us that the scriptures were written for our instruction and encouragement, and will encourage us to live in harmony with one another, glorifying God. Christ came to fulfil God's promises to the Jewish patriarchs, and so that the Gentiles might glorify God's mercy.

In the Gospel John the Baptist living austerely in the Judean wilderness, to prepare the way of the Lord preaches repentance, and baptises those who repent of their sins. He denounces the Pharisees who come to his baptism, because they are not sincere, and do not bear fruits of repentance. The greater one who is coming, says John, will not baptise with water, but with the Holy Spirit and fire, which will burn up the chaff, while he gathers the wheat into his barn.

Monday is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Our Lady. Mass is at 6.00 pm. God preserved Mary from the stain of original sin from the first moment of her

conception in her mother's womb, so that she might become a worthy Mother of his Son.

On Wednesday, the Mass is at 9.00 am, not 6.00 pm, because in the evening we are hosting a fundraising concert for the Hammersmith Branch of Age UK.

On Thursday, the Mass is at 9.30 am, not 9.00 am, so that it can be attended by St Mary's Catholic Primary School to celebrate their Patronal Festival of the Immaculate Conception of Our Lady.

Next Sunday is Gaudete Sunday, the mid-Advent Sunday of rejoicing because Christ's coming is now near, The third candle on the Advent wreath and the vestments of the priest are both rose-pink in colour as a sign of our joy and hope.

Next Sunday we will bless Bambinelli at the start of the 10.00 am Family Mass: the figures of the Baby Jesus, the Bambino, which you will place in your Christmas cribs at home. Please be sure to bring your along – whether you are an adult or a child!

The Christmas Service Times leaflet is published, also giving the special Confession times before Christmas.

Last Sunday there was an Appeal made by Fr Melaku on behalf of the Comboni Missionary Fathers, which was our official diocesan mission appeal for 2025. So far at least £1175 has been raised.
