Today's Bible Readings

In the Old Testament Reading Moses has led the people of Israel out of their slavery in Egypt, and now God is making his covenant with them at Mount Sinai. If they obey God's voice and keep his covenant, he promises them that they will be his treasured possession, a kingdom of priests and a holy nation.

In the Second Reading St Paul tells the Christians of Rome that God shows his love for us by Christ's dying for us while we were still sinners. We were reconciled to God by the death of his Son.

In the Gospel Jesus has compassion for the crowds, because they were harassed and dejected, like sheep without a shepherd. He therefore sends out as Apostles his twelve disciples, to go to these lost sheep and announce to them the coming of God's kingdom, bringing healing to the sick, raising the dead, and casting out demons.

A First Communion Mass will be celebrated at 10.00 am today.

Next Sunday, 21st June, the 11.30 am Solemn Mass will be a Thanksgiving Mass for all our First Holy Communion children of the last few weeks and their families. The Mass will conclude with a brief period of Adoration and Benediction of the Blessed

Sacrament. Afterwards there will be a party in the Parish Centre for the First Communion children.

June is the Month of Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Gifts of flowers for our Shrine of the Sacred Heart will be welcomed.
