The words of Isaiah and the testimony of John the Baptist converge on a single mystery: Salvation is not just an idea, a technique, a moral program, or a philosophy for balanced living. Salvation is a Person with power who comes to recreate humanity from within.

That is why John the Baptist does not say, "This is a wise man," or "This is a new teacher." He says: "I have seen and I have borne witness that this is the Son of God." The Church exists to carry precisely this testimony. She does not announce Jesus as another lifestyle choice, or a great model to follow by our own means, but as the living God who enters history to save it and intervenes in our personal history too!

Christ, the new Adam, changes our human nature into a life-giving existence for free. He does not simply show us how to live better for ourselves; he gives us his power to live selflessly as a grace. This is true! This is the gift of God and the fullness of his marvellous plan for us. We can forgive our oppressors as a miracle, we can stop lying, we can pay our debts, we can take care of our elderly, we can have another child, we can be ridiculously generous with our goods, we can rejoice over the fortunes of the others, we can stop complaining, we can enter into suffering and the Cross, we can be people of the resurrection, we can LIVE GRATUITOUSLY. Jesus has the power to change us at our root—to move us from surviving and being merely alive to becoming life-giving spirits for others passing from fear to communion.
